

IMPERATIVE MOOD, Sěpěl-īre, *To bury.*

Present Tense.

Singular.

Fěl-em sěpěl-ī *Bury thou the cat*

Plural.

Căn-ēs sěpěl-ītě *Bury ye the dogs*

IMPERATIVE MOOD, Vۆc-āre, *To call.*

Future Tense.

Singular.

Ĕqu-am vۆc-āto *Thou shalt call the mare*

Cۆlumb-am vۆc-āto *He shall call, or let him call, the dove*

Plural.

Āsīn-ōs vۆc-ātōtě *You shall call the asses*

Pۆēr-ōs vۆc-anto *They shall call, or let them call, the boys*

IMPERATIVE MOOD, Mۆn-ēre, *To advise.*

Future Tense.

Singular.

Pۆell-am mۆn-ēto *Thou shalt advise the girl*

Hۆmīn-em mۆn-ēto

He shall advise, or let him advise, the man

Plural.

Ancill-ās mōn-ētōtĕ *You shall advise the maids*
 Serv-ās mōn-ento *They shall advise, or let them advise, the slaves*

IMPERATIVE MOOD, Dūc-ĕre, *To lead.*

Future Tense.

Singular.

Cān-em dūc-ĭto *Thou shalt lead the dog*
 Fĕl-em dūc-ĭto *He shall lead, or let him lead, the cat*

Plural.

Ĕqu-ōs dūc-ĭtōtĕ *You shall lead the horses*
 Ĕqu-ās dūc-ūnto *They shall lead, or let them lead, the mares*

IMPERATIVE MOOD, Nūtr-ĭre, *To nourish.*

Future Tense.

Singular.

Pŭĕr-um nūtr-ĭto *Thou shalt nourish the boy*
 Pŭĕll-am nūtr-ĭto *He shall nourish, or let him nourish, the girl*
