
The material in this Sheep project section was used in connection with two separate outings. The first was to a small local sheep dog trial in Blanau Ffestiniog. This was a very successful outing especially as the trial was a very small local one. The atmosphere was very informal and there was a chance to chat to the competitors and get to know the dogs. I recommend a small local show like this as the bigger trials are more formal so it is harder to see what is going on. For a child, running about on the field with the entrants' children is all part of the fun. We were well prepared, having looked at the pictures included here from Roy Saunders book *Sheepdog Glory* (Deutsch 1956) which appear by kind permission of the publisher Andre Deutsch. These pictures can be used in discussion of what happens at a sheepdog trial and also for colouring.



Also on this disk is *Sheep Farm in North Wales by* Eric J A Barker, (OUP1961) which appears by kind permission of Oxford University Press. This book is beautifully illustrated in black and white with pictures that could be coloured in pencil or water colour. Although a young child may only get a flavour of sheep farming from this book, older children would benefit from it even more. In this way the *Sheep* material can be used with mixed ages.



We also read James Herriot *Only One Woof* (1985 Michael Joseph) and *Floss* by Kim Lewis (1992 Walker Books). Your public library may have these or something similar. English sheet 5 on this CD is related to this topic. This topic lead naturally on to a discussion of the Lord Jesus Christ that Great Shepherd of the Sheep and there are two texts in the handwriting section on this CD which can be used in this connection. Sheep are included in *Little Elsie's Book of Bible Animals* on the second CD of the *Mothers' Companion*.
